



RICHLAND COUNTY LIBRARY BUILDING PROGRAM

Multiple Locations Across Richland County, South Carolina

A new main library and 6 new branch libraries were constructed as part of the original building program in 1999. The book capacity at the time was 750,000 books. The project goals were to minimize change orders and operating costs, which were successful. The cost per square foot was \$47.96. The cost of furniture/equipment totaled to \$1,369,260.

Since completing this program, M. B. Kahn continues to assist the Library with its needs. Over 25 years later, we were under contract once again to build more libraries and provide a complete "re-invention" of the existing libraries to meet modern technology and program requirements.

In November 2013, Richland County passed a \$59 million bond referendum to update all library locations by adding and reconfiguring space, technology, and resources to better fit the way customers need and use the library today. The Program includes \$15 million of improvements at the Main Library, which was completed in 2018. The Program also addressed improvements at each of the following locations:

- Main
- Cooper
- North Main
- St. Andrews
- Ballentine
- Southeast
- Blythewood

RICHLAND LIBRARY - MAIN BRANCH RENOVATIONS

1431 Assembly Street, Columbia, South Carolina

The renovation of the Main Library are the flagship of the Library as Studio concept. With each floor having a unique character: Arts and Literature, Media and Technology, Career Advancement and Education and Growth, Main will have a variety of spaces and places to create conditions for the activities and programs that the Richland Library is locally, regionally and nationally known for a community of users to flourish!

The staff elected to conduct renovations in phases so that they would not have to close completely during construction. Garden level renovations included the Children's Room, where staff "floated" throughout the system during construction to different departments, including outreach efforts in the community. Renovations to the Children's Room included an enhanced stuory area, a messy craft room, a shadow puppet tunnel, a learning studio and a reading nook. There is also a new entrance to the Children's Room that is stroller friendly. Still in place is the beloved mural based on the Maurice Sendak children's book "Where the Wild Things Are."

The teen center has been moved to the garden level and the Bostic Auditorium was moved to the first floor. Other first level renovations included new spaces for Film and Sound, a multi-use auditorium, galleries and more. A third level now houses the Business, Careers and Research Center and the second level houses new Studio Spaces.

Blythewood is steeped in history, the arts and a sense of community. The renovation project honored these qualities while addressing the needs for more meeting and programming space. Situated on a beautiful piece of property on McNulty Road, the expanded library enhanced the customer experience for readers, LegoTM builders and history buffs. The 2,400 sq. ft. addition provided space for new group meeting/study rooms, family restrooms and a teen area. Outside, there is a public art piece Water Tower Pavilion, inspired by the Blythewood steam train water tower, along with enhanced parking and an outdoor programming space.



The Edgewood Library, a partnership with the Columbia Housing Authority, was designed by local architecture firm Studio 2LR. The location features a library collection, holds pickup, computer access, a meeting room and flexible space for community partners. Located at Oak Drive and Elmwood, the 7,000 square feet library is a vibrant place to learn, create and share. Our team repurposed an abandoned Dollar General store into a new community center, complete with a bike repair station.

NORTHEAST LIBRARY RENOVATION

The renovation for Northeast is a multicultural, multigenerational location embracing lifelong learning to foster competence and confidence for all ages and stages. Identified as a need in the community, Northeast is a destination for the county to promote a commitment to health and well-being with a special emphasis on nutrition and healthy food choices, with interior and exterior spaces to support this relevant and innovative programming. The 15,000 sq. ft. facility was renovated with an addition that includes two tutor rooms or small conference rooms that increased meeting room size by 1,650 square feet. New space includes storage and teaching kitchen, exterior improvements, addition of outdoor programming and the re-paving of parking facilities.



LIBRARY BUILDING PROGRAM

Charleston County, Multiple Locations Across Charleston County, South Carolina

Local residents overwhelmingly approved a referendum to build five new libraries and renovate 13 others in November 2014. In all, five new libraries were built: two new branches in areas of rapid growth and three to replace outdated facilities. A major focus includes upgrading technology by adding self check-out kiosks, more public computers and the latest equipment in public meeting rooms.




BEES FERRY WEST ASHLEY LIBRARY






R. KEITH SUMMEY NORTH CHARLESTON LIBRARY
