Asparagus (P)	Tomato, parsley, basil	
Basil	Tomato, sweet peppers	Rue, anise
Beans	Beets, carrots, cauliflower, celeriac, celery, corn, cucumber, marigolds, potatoes, strawberry, summer savory	Onion, garlic, gladiolus, fennel
Beets	Onion, kohlrabi, bush beans, lettuce, cabbage family	Pole beans, mustards
Borage	Strawberry, fruit trees	
Cabbage Family (broccoli, kale, cauliflower, collards, cabbages etc.)	Aromatic herbs, hyssop, thyme, wormwood, potatoes, celery, dill, chamomile	Strawberry, tomato, beans, mustards, pole beans
