General Session Speakers

First General Session - Wednesday, October 21



Marjory Wentworth – The opening keynote session will feature the Poet Laureate of South Carolina and fivetime Pushcart Prize nominee, Marjory Wentworth. Her four books of poetry include the most-recently published, New and Selected Poems. She is co-writer with Juan Mendez of Taking a Stand: The Evolution of Human Rights, co-editor with Kwame Dawes of Seeking: Poetry and Prose inspired by the Art of Jonathan Green, and the author of the prizewinning children's story Shackles. Wentworth is on the faculty at The Art Institute of Charleston, is the co-founder and former president of the Lowcountry Initiative for the Literary Arts, serves on the Editorial Board of USC's Palmetto Poetry Series, and is the poetry editor for Charleston Currents.

Second General Session - Thursday, October 22



Catherine Hakala-Ausperk – The second general session will feature Catherine Hakala-Ausperk, the Executive Director of the Northeast Ohio Regional Library System (NEO-RLS). Hakala-Ausperk is the author of *Be A Great Boss: One Year to Success, Build a Great Team: One Year to Success,* and the upcoming *Renew Yourself! Energize Your Career at Any Stage* (2016)—all published by ALA Editions. She is a consultant and frequent speaker at national and state conferences, staff days, and workshops. She has a passion for supporting, coaching, and developing successful libraries, staff members, and leaders. Hakala-Ausperk is a 31-year public library veteran and an adjunct faculty member of Kent State University's School of Library and Information Science.

Third General Session - Friday, October 23



Wiley Cash - The third general session will feature best-selling author, Wiley Cash. His debut novel, A Land More Kind Than Home, was a New York Times best-seller followed by the critically-acclaimed This Dark Road to Mercy. Wiley is currently working on his third novel. His stories have appeared in Crab Orchard Review, Roanoke Review, and The Carolina Quarterly, and his essays on Southern literature have appeared in American Literary Realism, The South Carolina Review, and other publications. He teaches at UNC-Chapel Hill and in the Low-Residency MFA Program in Fiction and Nonfiction Writing at Southern New Hampshire University. He is a native of North Carolina. Currently, he and his wife and daughter live in Wilmington.

CALL FOR POSTER SESSIONS

Poster Sessions are conducted each year at the South Carolina Library Association's annual conference. Poster Sessions are an effective visual forum for exchanging information, a means to communicate ideas, research, and future trends, and a great way to highlight successful library programs and services. Poster Sessions consist of presentation materials such as pictures, data, graphs, diagrams, and narrative text placed on display boards. During the conference time allotted for Poster Sessions, presenters informally discuss their projects with conference attendees. Up to thirty (30) simultaneous poster sessions will be selected for presentation during the 2015 SCLA Annual Conference. Please join this well-attended event.

Poster Sessions will be presented on Friday, October 23, from 8 a.m. to 9 a.m. You may set up your poster between 7:30 a.m. and 7:50 a.m.

POSTER SESSION GUIDELINES AND TIPS

Poster Session Guidelines:

- Presentation consists of a single poster board with a surface area of 4' (122cm) high by 6' (183cm) wide. Or, a central poster with one or two foldout wings, no larger than 48" total height by 72" total width (including wings). Other configurations are possible but may not exceed these dimensions.
- Poster Session content: Posters may present any of the following:
 - ⇒ A description of an innovative library program or service
 - \Rightarrow An analysis of a practical problem-solving effort
 - \Rightarrow A report of a research study
- Electricity is NOT available; WiFi is sometimes available in a conference poster session area, but should not be relied upon.
- A PowerPoint or other electronic presentation on a laptop can be used to supplement but <u>cannot be</u> <u>substituted</u> for an original poster presentation – your poster must be the primary visual focus of your presentation. Those who have strictly online or electronic materials to present are encouraged to conduct a conference session, where they may easily and effectively present information electronically to an audience. If you plan to use a laptop to supplement your presentation, be sure to bring an extra battery pack to last the duration of the session.
- Your poster must be in place by 8 a.m. Friday morning (October 23) and must be removed directly after the Poster Sessions close at 9 a.m.
- Those selected to present will be contacted by email no later than August 31 (September 16 for student spotlight participants) with directions and additional information.





POSTER SESSION GUIDELINES AND TIPS (Con't)

Poster Session Tips:

- The title/heading of your presentation should be simple, to the point, and catchy.
- The poster is primarily a visual display. The bigger the visual impact, the better!
- The information presented should be easy to follow and shown in a logical manner.
- Avoid clutter keep visuals and messages clear and concise.
- All materials and information should be visible and legible from four feet away.
- Handouts are not required, but are strongly encouraged. Provide your business card, or a slip with your contact information for those who have further questions.

SCLA Poster Session Competitions 2015 Student Spotlight and Viewers' Choice

Student Spotlight Competition: Only Poster Session presenters who are currently enrolled in a Master's program in librarianship are eligible to enter the student competition. Judges will determine a winner in the Student Spotlight Competition from among the entries based on the following criteria:

- \Rightarrow The topic is one of current interest or special importance to studies of library trends and practice.
- ⇒ The ability of the poster to deliver the information clearly and logically; visuals and text work together to convey information to the viewer.
- \Rightarrow Personal presentation is knowledgeable and comprehensive.
- \Rightarrow Viewer questions are welcomed and are completely answered.
- \Rightarrow Handouts (if available) are neatly presented and cover the information well.

Viewers' Choice Competition: All posters are automatically entered in the Viewer's Choice Competition. Poster Session attendees choose and vote for their favorite posters during the Poster Sessions.

Note: It is possible that a Student Spotlight Competition entry will also be selected as the overall Viewers' Choice winner.

The two winning presenters will each receive a paid one-year membership for the South Carolina Library Association.

Student Spotlight entrants must complete the competition section on the poster session registration form if they would like their poster to be considered for this award.

Entrants must indicate whether they will need a student or professional membership in 2016.
